



### Lava Ladies




We don't have an event scheduled for December but reflecting on our 2018 activities I think we have a lot to be proud of!



# Jim's technical tip

#### Winter Storage of the Model A

Not all of us are lucky enough to be able to drive their Model A in the winter. I've been asked for tips on how to store the car for a few months.

Keeping the cooling system full of antifreeze that is strong enough for your expected winter temperatures is a good place to start. This is better than draining the cooling system, because all of the moisture in the block after you drain it will cause a lot of rust in the block over the winter. Then the rust goes into your coolant next spring.

It is best to change the engine oil last thing before storing it. Bring it into the storage area after driving for at least 20 minutes, to get the oil good and hot, and drain it hot right where you plan to park the car for the winter. Refill with fresh oil and you will be ready to go next spring!

If you have an unheated garage, I recommend you remove the battery from the car and store it inside for the winter. Either keep a battery tender on it while in storage or connect a battery charger to it once a month for a few hours to top it back up. If you choose to leave the battery in the car, disconnect the ground strap or open any battery cutoff switch that you have, to avoid any parasitic drain over the winter. Put a charger on it once a month.

If you have 4 jack stands, put the car up on them to take the weight of the car off of the tires. Our tires will develop flat spots if they sit in one spot for a long time. The flat spots will eventually work out as you drive next year, but why not prevent them?

While the car is up on stands for the winter, you can adjust the brakes, grease the chassis, check under the car for good electrical connections, and check the status of all of your cotter pins under there. Adjust the clutch pedal. Take care of little things that you noticed needed attention while driving last season. Then you can start the spring driving season with a great Model A Day!

Send a Brick for Christmas!



**Sticking Choke Rods** 

This "A Tip" is about sticking choke rods. The current suppliers of choke rod/firewall grommet kits often supply you with a rubber grommet to be used on the firewall where the choke rod protrudes. Do not use this grommet! The use of this grommet often causes binding between the three points of contact for the choke rod.

Ford only used the leather and metal washer on the engine side of the firewall which is also supplied in the normal kit. When properly installed the choke rod has the correct clearance to operate smoothly.

### Guidelines for awarding Bruno the Breakdown Brute (aka Henrietta)

- 1. Accepting the chicken is optional, and no one is required to accept it. if it is not fun for you and you'd rather not participate, that's ok, it is only meant to be fun.
- 2. The awarding of the chicken is based upon a holdup to a tour, or an inconvenience to the other tour participants. it is not awarded strictly on a vehicle failure.
- 3. The chicken does not stay with one car in the event of subsequent breakdowns on the same tour. the chicken moves on to the next breakdown vehicle when a new breakdown occurs. exception: if a major breakdown is followed by a very minor breakdown, the chicken may stay with the original vehicle instead of moving on.
- 4. The awarding of the chicken starts afresh with each tour. the chicken assignment typically does not live on to a next tour, but may be awarded for infractions occurring between tours, in special cases.
- 5. There is only one "real" chicken on each tour.
- 6. Usually, the tour leader decides and awards the chicken, however, any tour participant can make suggestions as to a candidate for the chicken.
- 7. On overnight tours, the chicken award lives throughout the entire tour, or until the next breakdown on the current tour.
- 8. Any breakdowns of a more serious nature, such as a fender bender, a personal injury, a catastrophic failure that causes a vehicle to retire from a tour, etc., are not candidates for the chicken award. the intent is to have fun, not harass anyone at a serious moment or difficult time.
- 9. These are guidelines, not hard and fast rules.

### **TINY TIPS**



# HARD STEERING

If you feel that your Model A is steering harder than other Model A's, harder than it should, there are several things you can do to ease the problem.

- I. Check your front end castor; too much castor (caused by sagging front spring) can cause difficult steering.
- 2. Improper steering adjustment; over-adjusting to remove play.
- 3. Worn front tires.
- 4. Low air pressure 35 psi minimum pressure is recommended.
- 5. Lack of steering lubrication.
- 6. Improper steering box lubricant.
- 7. Worn steering arm balls.

If all the above have no effect, there is a product on the market to ease your steering. It is in kit form. It includes the replacement of the drag link and tie-rod ends with teflon, and can be obtained through your Model A outlet stores.


