How did Henry Ford treat his workers?

Ford believed that a good pay rate would increase the loyalty of his workers to the Ford Motor Co. A lower turnover rate would mean less downtime and lower expenses for recruiting and training new workers. Ford added a sociological department that evaluated and tried to improve his workers' lives. However, he opposed unions, as he believed that he understood what his workers needed the most. Over the years, Ford became widely recognized as a caring industrialist who empathized with blue-collar workers.

Ford not only cared for his workers but his customers as well. In 1908, he designed the Model T car for the common people. The model became so immensely popular that the company couldn't manufacture enough cars to meet the high demand. In 1913, Ford decided to incorporate a motorized assembly line for a faster and less expensive production. The efficient assembly line allowed the company to save on manufacturing costs. Ford cut the price by more than \$500 to make the cars more affordable to the masses.




Jim's Tech Tip

A film builds up on glass with time as you drive, especially on the windshield. About once a year it helps if you give the glass a very thorough cleaning. I use a paper towel with a LITTLE lacquer thinner on it to remove the film. You will see the black slime on the paper towel as you go. (Obviously, don't get the thinner on your paint.) Then follow up with a good glass cleaner. My favorite cleaner is called "Sprayway Streakless Glass Cleaner"; it has no ammonia. I know WalMart stocks it, other stores probably do, too. It really gets the glass clean and shiny.





The B.F. Goodrich and Firestone tire companies began opening tire stores with combined service and lubrication facilities in large cities around the country in the late-1920s. Goodrich opened a number of new outlets in the Los Angeles, California area in the early-to-mid-1930s probably in an effort to retain its market share during the Great Depression.

These staged promotional photos were taken by the Dick Whittington photo agency of a Goodrich service station on Elk Street in the Glendale neighborhood of Los Angeles (one of Wittington's 1932 Ford Model "B" roadsters is used as a prop.) On the far-right-hand side of the image are a service area and next to it the lubrication facilities. The second photo below shows a Goodrich balloon tire on a special rim to suit it.


