One of the first things you will notice when you drive the new Ford is the quick, effective action of its six-brake system.

This system gives you the highest degree of safety and reliability because the four-wheel brakes and the separate emergency or parking brakes are all of the mechanical, internal expanding type, with braking surfaces fully enclosed for protection against

mud, water, sand and grease.

The many advantages of this type of braking system have long been recognized. They are brought to you in the new Ford through a series of mechanical improvements embodying much that is new in design and construction.

There is perhaps no single feature of the new Ford which represents such a decided step forward in automobile engineering as the unique yet simple way by which a special drum has been constructed to permit the use of two separate sets of internal brakes on the rear wheels. The brake construction on the front wheels also is unusual. Here the brakes are fully enclosed without the necessity of a leather boot or sliding joint to protect the linkage between the brake rods and the mechanism on the brake plate. Such simplicity of design helps to insure reliability and long life.

A further improvement in braking performance is effected by the self-centering action of the four-wheel brakes—an exclusive Ford



feature. This construction brings the entire surface of the shoe in contact with the drum the instant you press your foot on the brake pedal.

There are definite reasons, therefore, for the safety and reliability of the new Ford brakes—for their quick ease of operation—for the smooth yet commanding way they take hold at a slight pressure on the brake pedal or hand lever.

Another feature of the brakes on the new Ford is the ease of adjustment. You can do it yourself quickly and without trouble.

The four-wheel brakes are adjusted by turning a regulating screw located on the outside of each brake plate. This screw is so notched that you can set all four brakes alike simply by listening to the "clicks."

The emergency or parking brakes require little attention. However, should they need adjustment, consult your Instruction Book for a clear explanation. If you do not care to do the work yourself, see a Ford dealer who will give you prompt, courteous and economical service.

## Model 'A" ERA Nursing Uniforms and Changes Today

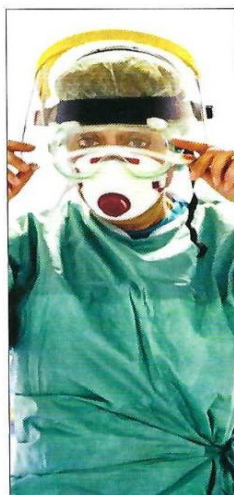


**NURSES:** The shape of the Model A Era nurses uniform was generally long and slender. The dress was usually white and made of cotton or linen. White stockings were worn with black low heeled shoes with a strap or white oxford style. This photo shows nurses in the Operating Room wearing cotton surgical gowns with cotton masks covering the mouth and nose.

Today's nurse may wear coveralls, gowns, masks, hoods, goggles, and face shields to prevent skin and respiratory contamination and a respirator to prevent inhalation of infected particles.





## TECHNICAL TIP... Winter storage:

*This is covered every year, but a little reminder doesn't hurt!*

### Check your coolant

If you run straight water in your cooling system, now is the time to drain it before it freezes. Much better idea... A 50/50 mix of water and anti-freeze is a safe way to protect your cooling system. It not only prevents freezing but also prevents corrosion.

### Change the oil

Although your oil may look clean it picks up combustion by-products that can damage the inside of your engine. Change the oil then run the engine up to temperature to ensure the new oil is distributed throughout the engine.

### Tires

Some suggest over-inflating the tires 5 – 10 psi to help reduce flat spots. Others like placing the car on jack stands. But make sure the suspension is not hanging, which puts the suspension under abnormal stress.

### Fill the gas tank?

If it's not practical to drain it completely, at least use a fuel stabilizer. Then... with the car running, shut off the gas valve to remove most of the gas from the carburetor. (Don't forget to shut off the key!)

### The battery

Using a battery tender/maintainer will make sure that your battery is charged and ready to go come spring.

### The exterior/interior

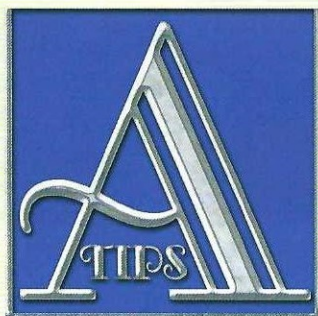
Clean the exterior & interior of your car. Make sure there is nothing on/in your car that may become permanent. A car cover is a great idea.

### Mouse/critter deterrent

There are many ideas on what works; the internet is full of things to try. I seem to have good luck with Mothballs; I just open a box and leave it set (open) on the floor.

## Quick Carburetor Cleaning by Tom Laupp, Andrews, Indiana

This A Tip comes from Tom Laupp of Indiana with a tip on how to clean your Zenith Carburetors air bleed jet. Occasionally the idle jet clogs up with a little speck of dirt resulting in the complete loss of the idle system. A short blast of compressed air blown down the hole after removing the air bleed screw will often remedy this problem. If it repeats, a thorough cleaning of the carburetor is in order especially the secondary well area where the idle air bleed jet resides.

### LUBRICATING LOCKS

**THE BEST LUBRICANT I HAVE FOUND FOR CAR DOOR LOCKS, TRUNK HANDLE LOCKS, AND IGNITION LOCKS, RECOMMENDED BY EVERY LOCKSMITH THAT I KNOW, IS DRY POWDERED GRAPHITE.**



**YOU BUY THE GRAPHITE IN A SMALL TUBE WITH A POINTED TIP. YOU INSERT THE TIP INTO THE KEY HOLE AND "PUFF" SOME GRAPHITE INTO THE LOCK. THEN YOU INSERT AND REMOVE THE KEY SEVERAL TIMES TO WORK THE GRAPHITE INTO THE LOCK TUMBLERS, AND OPERATE THE LOCK A FEW TIMES.**

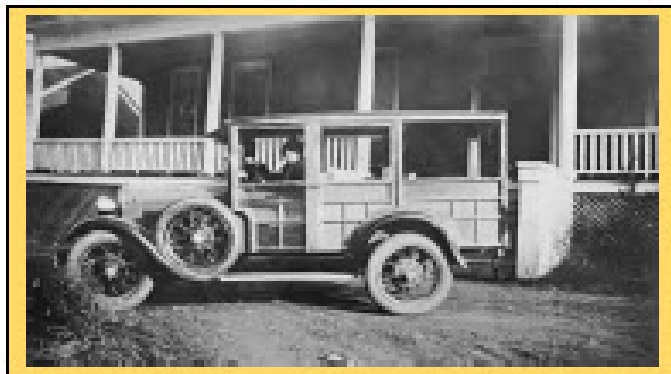

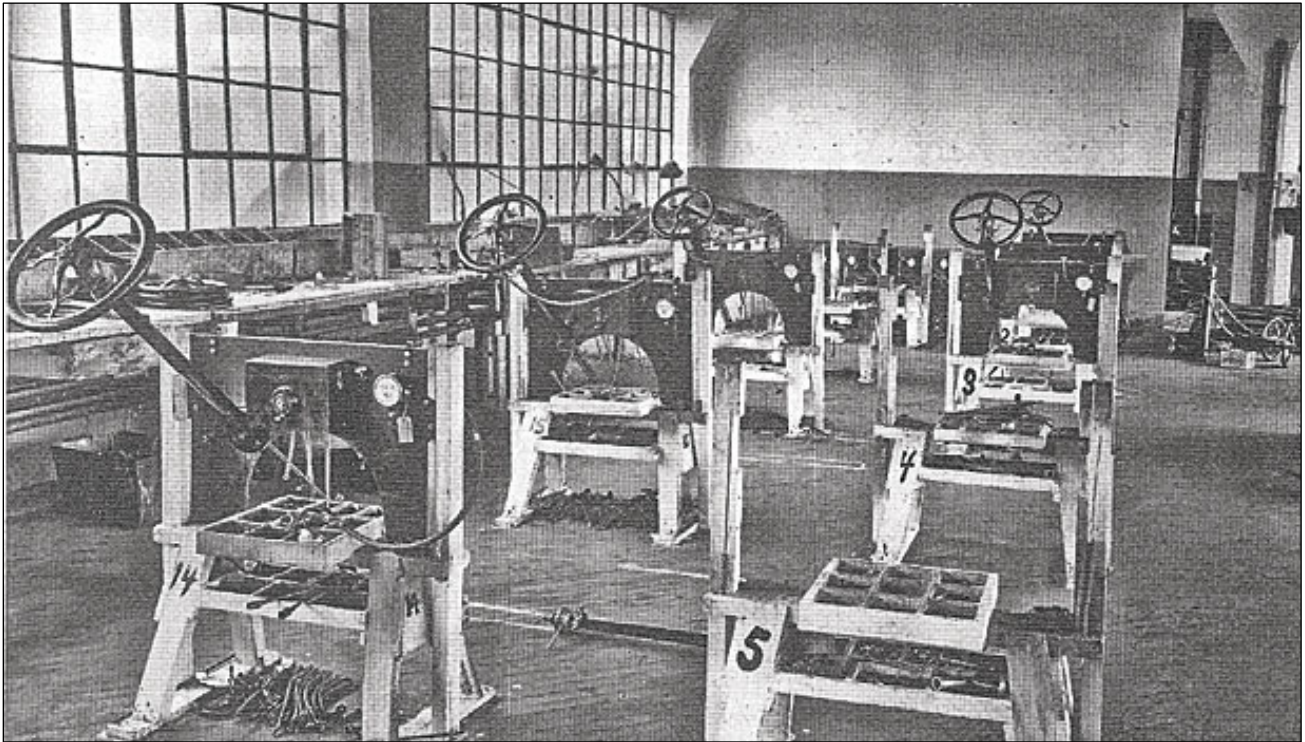


