That Good Gulf - A Street Corner Gasoline Station in the South



This Gulf Refining Co. gasoline filling station was located at 202 South Limestone St. and the corner of High St. in the city of Lexington, KY. Based on the appearance of the dark colored three-window coupe in the foreground, our guess is that this photo was taken in the mid-1930s. "That Good Gulf" was one of the Company's marketing slogans for a number of years during the twenties and thirties.

The appearance of the station and the lack of any oil spots on the concrete may indicate that this station had just opened, and the photos were publicity shots. If you can identify the make, model and year of either of the two coupes.


